



Shreveport, LA .50 BMG Sanctioned Match Program October 8th, 9th and 10th-2010

Friday October 8th

11:00 am Range open, sign-up; tech inspection and sight-in. (* note: anyone who does not have their gun zeroed to 1000 yds will be required to go to the 200 yd line to zero their rifle.)

4:00 PM Sign-up closes- squading for bench assignments & pit duty

6:00 pm Conclude activities at range for day

Saturday October 9th

0630 am Competitors who have not registered or sighted in need to arrive.

0700 am Safety meeting ***All competitors and pit crew MUST attend***

0730 am Pit crew set up

0800 am Commence Competition

After completion of relays #1 & #2 there will be a 30 minute break for lunch and pit crew change

After lunch break: Re-commence Competition

After completion of relay #3 & #4 conclude competition for day

After the sanctioned competition there will be a combined 600 yard **Practical 50 & Semi-auto timed fire event** these events will be fired Hunter Style and fired simultaneously-\$25

Sight in 5 minutes; shoot 5 in 60 seconds, score. Repeat for 20 rounds total.

Both bolt and semi's can compete in this fun shoot.

At the completion of the days shooting: Club BBQ (**Cash Donations are very welcome. All proceeds go to SCSC.**) Followed by a club meeting.

0730 am Pit crew set up

0800 am Commence Competition

After completing relays #1 & #2 pm 30 minute break for lunch and pit crew change

After lunch break Re-commence Competition

After relays #3 & #4 conclusion of competition and awards ceremony.

All competitors are strongly advised to register and sight in on Friday, as any late arrivals on Saturday morning will delay the start of competition.

Reminder: bring water, snacks, sun block, and rain gear. We are going to shoot rain or shine. Easy-ups for shade will probably be a good idea.
